

Chapter 19, Article II

Code of Ordinances provides that it shall be unlawful for any person to allow any collection of standing or flowing water where mosquitoes are likely to breed. With the recent years encephalitis problems in the state, this code has helped in keeping down a mosquito problem in our city.



Chapter 21, Article III

Code of Ordinances provides that vehicles not being used and maintained as operating vehicles and that have an accumulation of factors that make them a health or safety hazard are nuisance vehicles and subject to towing.

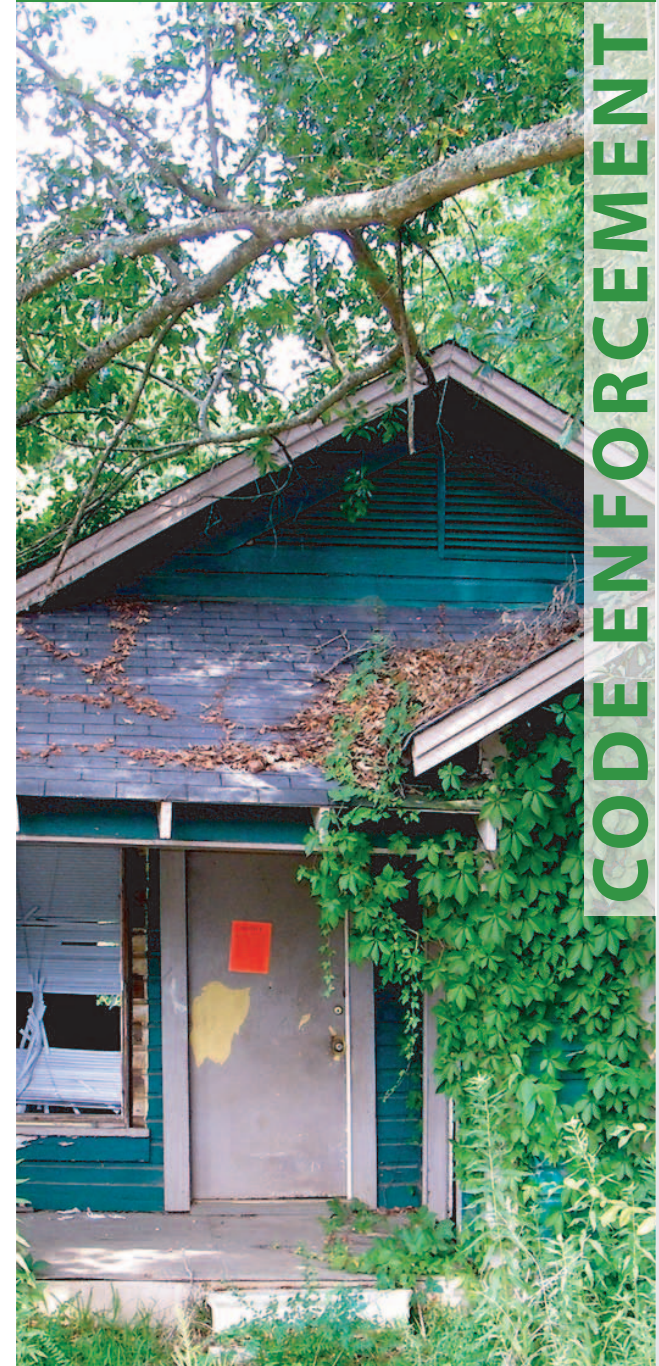
Chapter 22, Article III

The sign regulations deal with prohibited signs, nonconforming signs, and signs placed within public rights-of-way. Signage prohibited by the sign regulations includes, but is not limited to, signs located within public rights-of-way, and signs which are erected or maintained upon trees, fences, attached to any utility pole, regulatory sign or post or publicly-owned structure.

SUB-STANDARD STRUCTURES

Chapter 8, Article XI

Code of Ordinances provides the City a means to protect neighborhoods against physical, visual and economic deterioration caused by dilapidated and dangerous buildings. A process is set forth that will have these substandard structures either brought up to current building codes or have them demolished and removed.



TRASH & DEBRIS

Chapter 15, Article V

Code of Ordinances provides a requirement that all persons keep their property free of trash, garbage, and other debris, such as old appliances, metal objects, limbs, car parts, and furniture.

Chapter 15, Article V

Code of Ordinances provides that no person will allow property in the city limits to grow grass and weeds to a height of more than ten inches.
